Ambassador Abioye was employed into the Kwara State Civil Service as an Administrative Officer in 1984. He rose through the ranks, rising from Administrative Officer 2 to Deputy Director of Administration and Finance and served in those capacities in the State Health Management Board, Ministries of Health, Education, Lands and Housing, General Services - department of Governor's Office. Before his retirement from the service in 2016, he rose to the position of Director of Administration and Finance, in which capacity he served in the ministries of Information, State Universal Basic Education Board (SUBEB) Sport and Youth Development. Social Welfare and Culture, Health, Agriculture and Natural Resources. He once served as the Executive Secretary of Kwara State Muslims' Pilgrim Welfare Board.

Ambassador Abioye was born in Omu-Aran in the mid-50s and he is an active member of the community development association. He is also the current president of one of the town's premier clubs, named the Omu-Aran Social Club. Ambassador Abioye is the General Secretary of Muslim Community.

As a politician, he is a member and leader of the All Progressive Congress (APC) in Kwara State.

In 2020, he was appointed Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary by President Muhammadu Buhari (GCFR), President and Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of Nigeria.
